

A monolithic floor framing system consists of a slab on beams and girders. The slab is 6 inches thick and the beam is 12 inches wide and 30 inches tall. The beam is lightly reinforced so that the neutral axis is very close to the compression face. The beams are 20 feet long and regularly spaced at 8 ft on center. In computing the moment capacity of the beam at its support \underline{AND} at its midspan, what should the appropriate width of the beam should be used in the standard equation for computing M_n for a singly reinforced concrete beam having a rectangular shape? Clearly identify what value of b is appropriate




Problem 2



The beams self-weight may be assumed to be 0.8 kips/ft (i.e., this includes an allowance for the actual weight of the beam - do not recalculate the dead load based on the actual size you estimate for the beam). The beam supports a single concentrated live load at its end equal to 40 kips.

- d. In the sketch, clearly indicate where the rebars are to be located in the section and elevation.
