Course Description:

This course offers a survey of 20th century Korean literature, with emphasis on short fictions. We approach short fictions as the repository of ideas, discourses and formal experiments on the complex, discontinuous and contradictory development called modernity. It traces the beginning of Korea's modern literature at the beginning of the 20th century and chronologically examines the canonical works from the colonial era. The liberation of 1945 and the ensuing era of the Cold War ushered in new themes, preoccupations and narrative features into Korean literature. We bring attention to the ways in which literary texts have engaged with the complex forces and repercussions that shaped Korea's modern experiences. How literary texts have historically thematized and problematized the lingering issues of social transformation and cultural identity is of primary concern. The course includes a number of film screenings. No prerequisites required. All readings are in English translation.
